

Always having been part of the maritime history of Northern Europe, today's Estonia and Latvia retain the charm of Hanseatic cities, while at the same time offering untouched nature, cultural heritage and developed modern economy.

The destinations of the East Baltic Coast offer diverse sailing experience along sandy or rocky beaches and cosy small islands. You can visit fishing villages, the green countryside, port cities, vibrant capitals – Tallinn and Rīga, popular resorts and gourmet restaurants. And you can enjoy a pleasant and safe stay in the well-equipped and modern marinas.

This cruising guide provides information about the marinas: contacts, approach guides, available services and advice for tourists. Marinas are presented in five chapters that are arranged geographically, starting from Liepāja Marina in the south and continuing along the coastline to the north:

Western Latvia - Kurzeme - covers the coastline of the Baltic Sea and continues to the Kolka Cape - the very northern point of Kurzeme region. Marinas in this part are located in estuaries of the largest rivers. There is a good connection to the Saaremaa Island (Estonia) and Gotland (Sweden) from these marinas.

The Gulf of Rīga includes both **Latvian** and **Estonian** marinas. The Gulf of Rīga is a gentle sailing area which invites to enjoy endless sandy beaches. Mooring at the very centre of Rīga, the metropolis of the Baltics, allows to discover this dynamic port city on the trade route between the Western Europe and the East. Enjoy sailing along the coastline and take off to discover the Estonian islands.

Western Estonia is comprised of almost 30 marinas, both on the islands and mainland, located close to each other. It is worth to spend few hours sailing to visit Saaremaa, Hiiumaa, and several smaller islands, where the unspoiled nature, local traditions, and rural atmosphere will charm you.

The Gulf of Finland is the northern part of the East Baltic Coast. Sailing around Tallinn allows to visit the city or to discover smaller islands nearby. Here you may start the journey towards St. Petersburg (Russia) or continue up to Scandinavia – by the shortest route across there are only 45 nmi to Helsinki.

May this guide provide you with the insights that will make sailing at the East Baltic Coast an unforgettable and pleasant experience!

SAILING CONDITIONS IN

THE BALTIC SEA

CLIMATE AND WEATHER (CLIMATIC SUMMARY)

The Baltic Sea has a temperate continental climate. Spring and autumn are relatively long in the coastal regions of the Baltic Sea. Winds from the N and NE bring cold arctic air to the area, resulting in severe frost in winter. W winds bring humid and E winds bring dry air masses to the Baltic Sea, determining the local precipitation pattern.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The East Baltic Coast region altogether has over 2400 nautical miles of shoreline from Lithuania to Estonia Lithuania: 45 nmi. Latvia: 286 nmi, Estonia: 2051 nmi. The shortest crossing from Latvia to Sweden is 80 nautical miles, and from Estonia to Finland -25 nautical miles. There are over 2200 islands and islets in the region.

AIR TEMPERATURE

The region's climate is warmer and more humid than elsewhere at this latitude. The average temperature in the East Baltic is -6°C in January, and about 17°C in July. On clear summer days the temperature climbs over 30°C and is above 23°C on most days during summer.

WIND

Moderate to strong SW and N winds dominate in the open parts of the Baltic Sea. The wind pattern in the Gulf of Finland is different - SW and W winds dominate with strong and moderate winds; in spring and summer NE winds also occur quite often. Westerly storms are stronger than easterly storms, with maximum wind speed up to 22-23 m/s. The yearly average wind speed in the West Estonian Archipelago and in the open coastal areas of Baltic Sea, measuring 10 m from the ground level, is 6-7 m/s. The inland wind speed is significantly lower. Winds are stronger in autumn and spring, when the cyclonic activity is high, and pressure gradients between the low-pressure area of Iceland and the high-pressure area of Siberia are high. In spring and summer, a local wind blowing onshore in the daytime

and offshore at night is quite frequent, the reason for which lies in the difference between temperatures of the sea and the land.

HUMIDITY

The soft maritime climate results in a significant amount of water vapor in the air throughout the year. The air is moister in the autumn and winter. In spring, the weather is mainly dry and clear. Relative humidity is the lowest in May and June, when it decreases to 70% in the area of the Gulf of Rīga.

VISIBILITY

Good visibility is a common feature on the East Baltic Coast. In about 80% of observations, visibility is greater than 5 nmi in summer.

As a result of relatively high humidity and the thermal contrast of land and sea, fog is quite common on the coast and above the coastal sea, causing visibility to drop to less than 0.5 nmi. During the warm season, the temperatures that generate fog in May are 4...5°C and in July – 12...15°C. From August till October, fogs emerge most often at low temperatures – 2...12°C.

CLOUDINESS

The sky is usually cloudy in cyclonic conditions, and clear in anticyclonic conditions. Cyclones reach the region quite rarely in spring and summer, most frequently in November and December. There is a very close connection between cyclonic activity and the amount of low clouds (stratocumulus, stratus, nimbostratus). Cloudiness is the highest in November and December.

PRECIPITATION

The average annual rainfall in the coastal area is between 550–650 mm. The highest rainfall occurs in August; on the islands in the Gulf of Finland – also in September and October. There are approximately 100–120 rainy days per annum, assuming a rainy day is a day with at least 1 mm of precipitation.



ATMOSPHERIC PHENOMENA

There are approximately 12-14 days with thunderstorms per annum in the area, mainly from May until August, very rarely during other months. Heavy rain, hail, strong gusts, tornados, and squalls at sea usually occur together with thunderstorms; in rare occasions you can also witness waterspouts.

Mirages, i.e., fata morganas occur quite often during spring and autumn in clear and quiet weather, like a natural convex lens that optically deforms the visible distance and dimensions of objects. Objects observed visually at sea or on the coast, as well as islands, may appear to be higher than they really are or shifted aside.

HYDROLOGY (CURRENTS)

There are almost no permanent currents in the Baltic Sea. The speeds of tidal currents are also slow – 0.02–0.04 kn, although in some areas of the Baltic Sea current speeds may rise to 0.2 kn as a result of different tidal components.

The main driving force of currents in the Baltic Sea is the wind. The surface current that appears with permanent wind is directed 45 degrees to the right of the wind direction. In deeper waters, the flow turns clockwise. In shallow waters, the surface current's direction is more similar to the wind's direction. In moderate winds, the typical surface current speed in the open waters of the Baltic Sea is 0.3–0.4 kn and in the gulfs – 0.2–0.3 kn.

SEA LEVEL

The Baltic Sea, as a typical inland sea, is separated from the ocean by the narrow and shallow Danish Straits. Limited water exchange through the straits determines the hydrology of the brackish water and the dynamics of the water masses in the Baltic Sea. Research has shown that tides in the Baltic Sea cause only minor fluctuations in the water level, 5–7 cm.



Fluctuations in the sea level of the Baltic Sea occur mainly due to seasonality. Momentary values of sea level may change within the amplitude of 2.3 m in most parts of the coastal sea, but it may vary at different parts of the coast due to the character of the coastal sea, local wind patterns, etc. The sea level near the coast changes within the range of +130 cm and -100 cm.

SEA STATE

The Baltic Sea is a relatively small and closed area. Quite sharp wind waves predominate, having mainly the same direction as the wind in the open part of the sea. The Baltic Sea is mostly calm during spring and summer.

During light and moderate winds, the wave height in both coastal and open sea is relatively even. Wind speeds of 6–8 m/s produce waves of significant height of up to 1 m, and wind speeds of 9–11 m/s produce waves up to 1.5 m. In even stronger winds, the wave height substantially varies in different parts of the sea, depending on the wind direction and persistency, and reaches its peak in 6–8 hours.

WATER TEMPERATURE

The yearly average water temperature in coastal Baltic Sea is 7.1...7.4°C, influenced mainly by air temperature. The highest average water temperatures occur in July and August (15.6...16.7°C). During calm and sunny summers, temperature in coastal surface layers rises up to 25°C, but may quickly drop to 5...10°. This phenomenon is called upwelling, where the warm surface layer is carried away by offshore winds and is substituted by cold water masses from deeper layers of the sea.

SEA ICE

Variability of sea ice formation, duration and breakup is extremely high, and every winter is unique. The freezing point of seawater in East Baltic Sea area is approximately -0.4°C due to the low salinity, and even higher in the vicinity of rivers discharging fresh water into the sea.

More than 180 leisure boat harbours – both small, cosy ones and five-star marinas – are available for a safe and comfortable stay. Some of them are located directly in lively cities, like Stralsund (Germany), Svaneke (Bornholm) or Klaipėda (Lithuania). Others are based close to endless sandy beaches, such as Świnoujście or Darłowo (Poland). At Klaipėda, the last stop before the East Baltic Coast, you can stay directly in the city (Klaipėda Castle Harbour) or on the Curonian Spit (Smiltynė Yacht Club Marina). And how about a stop-over in Kaliningrad (Russia)? That makes the journey from Poland to Lithuania a bit shorter and more exciting. And getting a visa is quite easy!


ACCESS TO THE MARINA FROM THE SEA

The fairway starts from the first pair of buoys, No. 1 and No. 2 (56°31.38000' N: 20°54.11000' E). Between the buoys you will see the central leading line (red); proceed by course 068°. After passing buoy No. 5, alter course to 112° and keep to the green leading line to south entrance. After passing green buoy No. 15, alter course to pilot leading line (green light), course 153°, and proceed forward, then alter course to portside and keep to the middle of the channel. Keep going till the end of channel. The marina is located at berths 80 and 81 on the starboard side of the channel, near a bridge.




ACCESS TO THE MARINA FROM THE SEA

The port of Ventspils can be identified from a considerable distance by the tall church spire, located in the town centre on the S side of the river. Currents in the river average 1 kn, increasing to 2 kn near the entrance. The current sets N or S along the coast in the port entrance, depending on the wind. The NW approach channel leads SE from lighted buoy "B" (57°28'.52 N; 21°25'.91 E) to the Ventspils Outer Harbour, protected by two breakwaters, N and S. When entering the harbour, turn into the fishing harbour and marina – it is located on the S (left) side of the Venta River. Ventspils Marina offers 110 m of mooring at a depth of 3.5 m. Tides are insignificant, but the water level fluctuates with wind conditions and may differ by 0.3 m above or below the mean.





The port of Mērsrags is a small yachting and fishing harbour formed by two breakwaters extending E from the mouth of a stream, the outlet from Lake Engure – a large lake which lays 1.5 to 2.5 km from the coast S of the harbour. The port is also used for the transhipment of timber and other cargoes. Mērsrags leading lights are two red lights. Fairway direction is 267°, the distance from the fairway lighted buoy to piers is 3.2 km.



Also, a wide variety of wild animals spend their days in Engure's meadows. Summertime is the time of the gorgeous orchids – and they alone are well worth the visit.

ACCESS TO THE MARINA FROM THE SEA

All ships must request information from the Harbour Master about the depths on the leading line before entering the port. The direction of the leading line is 270.2°-090.2°.

The depth on the leading line varies by season, especially during autumn and winter storms, as well as by meteorological conditions.



Rīga is the largest city in the Baltic States and the capital of Latvia, the centre of its political, economic and cultural life.

Rīga has always been a crossroads, a melting pot of various nations and cultures. It was founded in 1201 and is a former member of the Hanseatic League. In its 800 years of turbulent history, everyone from German knights to Swedish kings and Soviet commissars have left their mark, and today Latvia's capital is an exciting European metropolis at the crossroads of eastern and northern Europe.





The unique patina in this city, which has nearly 700,000 inhabitants, has been formed by the proximity of water - the Daugava River, and the Gulf of Rīga. Rīga Old Town is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, noted for its Art Nouveau architecture and the 19th century wooden architecture, and nowadays the historical old town is both a glamorous hub of the city and a cosy place to meet up with good friends. It is possible to arrive in Rīga via all three means of transportation - air, land and water - and the city can be observed from both above and the water. Like any city full of creative energy, it vibrates, pulsates, and astonishes at any time of year.

MANILAID

MUNALAID

Tallinn's UNESCO-preserved Old Town is a beautiful medieval town, where traces left over from the German Crusades during the latter part of the Middle Ages can still be found.





This perfectly preserved cobble-stoned part of the city offers a fascinating overview of the region's tumultuous past, and exploring it on foot is a great way to immerse yourself in this intriguing heritage. Kadriorg was first established as a retreat exclusively for the Russian elite in the 18th and 19th century. One of the best-known museums in Estonia, the Kadriorg Art Museum, resides in the Kadriorg Palace which was built by Russian Tsar, Peter the Great.

Just on the other side of the Kadriorg Palace you can find the Presidential Palace, and even walk right up to the front door for a picture.

Enter the harbour along Pirita leading line $136.2^{\circ} - 316.2^{\circ}$ (Iso R 2 s – Iso R 4 s; orange round concrete tower with three white balconies – white square concrete tower). There is a FI R 3 s light beacon at the tip of the north breakwater and a FI G 3 s light beacon at the tip of the south breakwater. Iso R 2 s marks the Pirita leading line.





TALLINN-PIRITA TOP

Pirita Harbour is located east of the Tallin city centre. In addition to basic services, there are many boating equipment and clothing stores nearby, as well as restaurants and grocery stores. Pirita is known for its long beach and the spa hotel.

There is heavy traffic of fast ships and ferries in the Tallinn Bay, however, it does not influence the marina. Enter the harbour along Pirita leading line 136.2°-316.2° (Iso R 2 s - Iso R 4 s; orange round concrete tower with three white balconies - white square concrete tower). There is a FI R 3 s light beacon at the tip of the north breakwater and a FI G 3 s light beacon at the tip of the south breakwater. Iso R 2 s marks the Pirita leading line.

Naissaar harbour light beacon on shore – FI W/R/W 2 s; Naissaar harbour pier light beacon – FI G 2 s. A regular boat connection to Tallinn is available during summer.





KELVINGI

Kelvingi is a small village, located 13 km from Tallinn. The beach in Kelvingi is stony, and near the village there is a forest.


Sheltered from all directions. Entry unpleasant with NE winds.

Approach along 213°-33° towards the entrance of the marina. At the entrance there is a green beacon on the north breakwater (F G 2M G BN) and a red beacon on the south breakwater (F R 2M R BN). After passing the south breakwater, keep to port, as there are rocks at 1.6 m in the middle of the basin.

Prangli island is the most northerly island in Estonia with year-round inhabitants.

Safe water WP (59°38.40' N; 25°01.39' E) is located on the leading line 222.8°-42.8° (Q G 1 s - Oc G 4 s). There is a F G light beacon at the tip of the north breakwater and a F R light beacon at the tip of the east breakwater.

Entry is dangerous in strong NW winds and high sea.

Exposed only to NE winds and swell. Entry recommended only in daylight and good conditions. Several rocks surround the fairway. From 59°32.064' N; 025°9.866' E follow 223°-43° to the harbour entrance. The fairway is marked by lateral buoys.

Hara harbour, which used to be a submarine base, is situated in northern Estonia. Near the harbour is a beautiful hiking area.

Sheltered from all directions, some chop may appear due to partial breakwaters.

From 59°35'20" N; 25°37'21" E follow the outer breakwater in a southerly direction, then turn west into the marina. Vessels may moor to the buoys either stern or bow to the floating pier. Vessels over 24 m in length can use the deep-water buoys and have to use a tender for shore access.

Before entry, check with the Harbour Master.

VÕSU

Võsu is a historic trading place that has turned into a popular summer holiday destination. It is most famous for its 3 km long sandy beaches and pine forests. After having a lovely day at the beach, you can enjoy one of the many cafés and find a cosy place to stay the night.

No clearly marked waterway, but simple entrance to the harbour. Sheltered from all winds, exposed to chop from N, NW. Entry recommended only in daylight. From 59°35,496' N; 025°57,429' E follow 128°–308° to the gates.

At the entrance there is a green beacon (G BN Q G 2M) and a red beacon (R BN Q R 2M).





VERGI

Vergi harbour offers all the basic services that a sailor may need. Vergi has a 3 km hiking trail which shows the fishing village's history, and quite near Vergi (within 15 km) there are 3 famous Estonian manors (Palmse, Sagadi and Vihula).

Entry recommended in daylight. Approach by following the unlit Vergi leading line 261.8°–81.8°. Safe water WP is located on the leading line at 59°35.80' N; 26°07.00' E. Harbour entrance is in the white sector 356.0°–3.0° of Vergi lighthouse (FI W/R/G 3 s). The entrance is also marked by a leading line 1.6°–181.6° (daymarks) and lateral spar buoys. Shallow water on the west side of the breakwater.

From safe water WP1 ($59^{\circ}34.20'$ N; $26^{\circ}18.45'$ E) steer to WP2 ($59^{\circ}34.17'$ N; $26^{\circ}18.40'$ E) and follow the entry channel marked by lateral spar buoys. There is a light (FI R 3 s) at the tip of the east breakwater and a light (FI G 3 s) at the tip of the north breakwater.

PURTSE

Sheltered from all sides, narrow channel. Entry recommended only in daylight and good weather. From WP1 (59°26.6' N; 26°59.5' E) keep south to WP2 (59°26.25' N; 26°59.66' E). Follow the lateral spar buoys to the harbour.





TOILA

Toila is a well-renovated fishing harbour. There is a big, beautiful park, where you can take a nice walk, and nearby is the famous Toila spa.

Marina sheltered from all sides. Strong NW and NE winds can cause tidal rips at the river entrance. Entry recommended only in daylight. From WP1 (59°26.2' N; 27°32.0' E) steer to WP2 (59°25.69' N; 27°32.13' E; Toila harbour W breakwater light beacon FI G 3 s). When approaching the entrance, keep the west breakwater close to your starboard and enter the channel. Following the river, steer to the marina.

NARVA

Narva is the third largest city in Estonia, and it shares a border with Russia. The most famous tourist attractions are the Narva Castle, the Kreenholm Textile Factory and Narva College. You can observe classical Soviet-era architecture mixed with modern buildings.

Narva town harbour is situated 7 nmi upriver from the river mouth. The approach is safe, but steer right in the middle of the river. When steering in bends, keep to the outer side of the bend. Depth in the middle part of the Narva River, near the border between the Republic of Estonia and the Russian Federation, is 3.4–8.7 m. The border is marked by red ball fenders.





NARVA-JÕESUU

Narva-Jõesuu is famous for its white sand beach lined with pine trees. It has been a popular spa resort since the 19th century due to it being located very close to St. Petersburg (150 km).

Dangerous to enter in strong N, W winds and swell. Entry must be cleared with Estonian Coastguard by VHF Ch. 16. River flow ~1 kn. From Narva-Jõesuu safe water buoy (59°28.68' N; 28°00.97' E; LFI W 10 s) follow the unlit leading line 105.3°-285.3° to safe water buoy "B" (59°28.57' N; 28°01.90' E; LFI W 10 s). Follow lateral spar buoys and river leading line 162.0°-342.0° (Iso R 2 s - Iso R 4 s). Take care not to deviate into Russian territorial waters.
